markers, such as gender, race, ethnicity, religion,
ability, sexual orientation and class, never
operate independently of each other in the
context of power and privilege


 Intersection of Spirituality and Sexual Identity (Gold & Stewart, 2012)

Intersectionality Framework


- Stemming from legal and political

- Holistic characterization and salience




Intersectionality Methods

- Inequality and critical theory






